The Appalachian Trail in Georgia:

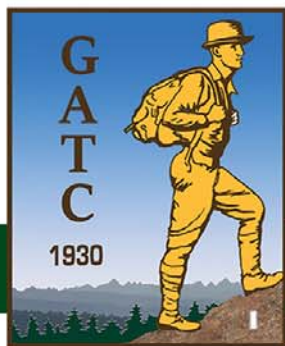
